


THE COLUMBARIUM AND MEMORIAL GARDEN OF TIMNATH PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH



Introduction

Q. What is a columbarium?

A. A columbarium is a group of “niches”, which serve as place of final deposition for the ashes of persons who have been cremated.

Q. Why cremation?

A. 1. Significant cost savings versus earth burial.
2. Easier on the environment – less space required than earth burial.

Q. Why a columbarium at Timnath Presbyterian Church?

A. In the past, burial space was provided in the church yard. More recently society has moved away from this practice. Now cremation makes possible a return to the deposition of remains on the church property, where visitation by family and friends is more convenient. Many persons take comfort in the fact that their remains will remain near where they and their family and friends have worshiped.

Glossary

Columbarium: A structure for the permanent deposition of cremains.

Cremation: The process of reducing a corpse to ashes.

Cremains: The product (ashes) of cremation.

Facing Stone: A granite face plate that covers a niche, with engraving of the names and dates of birth and death of the person(s) inurned.

Inurnment: The placing of an urn, with cremains, in a niche.


Memorial Garden: A landscaped area in the church yard containing the niches and a Remembrance Wall.

Niche: A space in the Columbarium, adequate to hold one or two urns.

Purchaser: The individual who purchases a niche, for him/herself or for others.

Remembrance Wall: A wall in the Memorial Garden where engraved granite facing stones can be mounted, engraved with names of persons whose remains are located elsewhere.

Urn: A container for cremains.

SCHEDULE OF PRICES

Niches and Remembrance Wall Stones

Timnath Presbyterian Church Columbarium and Memorial Garden

Single Inurnment, engraving at time of death	\$1500
Double Inurnment, engraving at time of deaths	\$2125
Remembrance Wall Stone, including engraving, one name	\$ 400
Remembrance Wall Stone, including engraving, two names	\$ 525

- Payments are due at time of signing a ‘Contract for Reservation of Inurnment or Remembrance Wall Space’.
- Payments may be made in installments. If so, the initial payment shall be for 25% of the full price, due at time of signing.
- If the purchaser cannot complete payment within six months of application for a niche or stone, 80% of the payments made will be refunded to the purchaser.
