

Dear Church,

For seven months now I've been returning here to Galatians 5:22 where the apostle Paul speaks of the "fruit of the Spirit" — the gifts that the Holy Spirit grows in our life together as he shapes us into the image of Christ. Each month we've been looking at a different "fruit," like *love, joy*, and *patience*. With the start of the fall season upon us — Sunday Christian Education beginning September 10, Confirmation for youth, men's and women's Bible studies — I was excited to write this column and express my gratitude for the fruit of *kindness* I've witnessed in you, showing such warmth as a congregation...But we already covered *kindness* a few months ago. So, then I was eager to charge you to cultivate something like the fruit of *faithfulness*, sticking with Jesus' invitation to pray or the opportunities to witness God's love that have obviously been handed to us...But we've already done *faithfulness*, too. No, according to my run down of things, as we kick-off the fall season and look at all the opportunities the Lord is opening for us, the fruit of the Spirit we've come to is *gentleness*.

"Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness..."

Gentleness just doesn't seem like a very exciting character quality, does it? Certainly not one that we hold dear today in 21st century America. Nor was it held dear in the societies of ancient Greece and Rome in which Paul was writing. Ambition? Sure. Strength? Yes! But, gentleness? I don't know a parent who holds their newborn at night and says to themselves, "I sure hope he grows up to be gentle." Gentleness is just not a character quality we champion. Nor is it a quality we usually see being carried in our current social and political climate. We're told to *be heard*, and we see everyone shouting louder. We're told to *be wary* and we live in a state of suspicion. But we're not usually told to *be gentle*. Which is maybe what makes it such a dynamic, counter-cultural witness to the gospel.

Addressing a crowd in Matthew 11:28-29, Jesus says, "'Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.'" *Weary* is what I see a lot of faces when I look around the world — people weary from external pressures and internal distress, 24/7 news, and scrolling screens in

the palm of their hand. *Carrying heavy burdens* is how I know some folks (maybe some of you?) feel. But it's precisely the weary and burdened whom Jesus invites to himself. "Come to me," he says, "for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." Rest for our weariness. Saving rest out of which we can then live and work. Rest that only comes from letting our hearts rest in in the Triune God. Jesus says, "Come to me...for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest." He who carried our burdens now extends rest to the burdened from his gentle and humble heart and we who live and rest in him can do the same

This is why Paul call *gentleness* a fruit of the Spirit. As we come to rest in Jesus through the Spirit and know the embrace of his gentle heart, we are in turn shaped and sent by the Spirit to offer his gentle embrace to the weary and burdened around us. So, church, how is the Holy Spirit cultivating gentleness among us so that we can offer this counter-cultural witness to the gospel in our community this fall?

Cut from the Confessions

This column features *clippings* from our historic creeds and confessions. Through 2023 we've looked at "The Theological Declaration of Barmen" — a brief but bold statement originally written by church leaders in Germany to help Christians withstand Nazi ideology.

This month we come to the end of our journey through the "Theological Declaration of Barmen." With the end let's notice two brief points. 1) The declaration invites our theology to shape our ideology and politics. The next to last line specifically states that those agree with the declaration (which for the writers would mean agree with the gospel) to be "mindful" of the "principles in their decisions in church politics." Of course, in Germany at the time church politics and state politics were deeply intertwined so the encouragements is really to let the gospel shape how we engage the political world. Too often, still today, Christians allow their politics to shape how they read the Bible and witness the gospel. Barmen reminds us it's meant to be the other way around. 2) The declaration invites the church back to the basics of "faith, love, and hope." In trying times and in all times these are the hallmarks of a Christian community - ever trusting in the Lord, ever showing the love we've been shown, ever hoping in the future he holds and acting as if that hope were now in hand.

6. ... The Confessional Synod of the German Evangelical Church declares that it sees in the acknowledgment of these truths and in the rejection of these errors the indispensable theological basis of the German Evangelical Church as a federation of Confessional churches. It invites all who are able to accept its declaration to be mindful of these theological principles in their decisions in church politics. It entreats all whom it concerns to return to the unity of faith, love, and hope.

Our Sunday Christian Education kicks off on September 10th. Don't miss out on these great ways to grow in faith together!


